- 2. Check the <u>UMD Biographical Files</u>. There is generally one file folder of newspaper articles about each person on this list.
- 3. Search the <u>ArchivesSpace Database</u>. (Does not include all of our collections yet) <u>Help with the ArchivesSpace Database</u>
 - This database includes descriptions of archival collections, but not digital materials. Please note that not all of the archival collections held by UMD are included in this database and that after your initial search, you may get results from archival repositories at the UMN Twin Cities campus along with results form UMD.
